### **Essential Needs for All Students Grades K-12 Program**

- \* Basic proficiency with technology and/or an ability to learn new technology.
- \* Ability to learn independently using a Learning Management System (i.e Canvas).
- \* A motivation and ability to learn independently with limited support from an educator.
- \* Excellent study skills and habits.
- \* Ability to connect to the internet with reliable high speed service.
- \* Ability and desire to collaborate with assigned educator and other virtual learning students. Collaboration may occur over a Learning Management System, email, or video conferencing.
- \* The program has been designed to meet the individual needs of all students and will be rigorous, challenging, and fully accredited.
- \* Commitment from a parent/guardian who is willing to be involved in their child's virtual learning program and communicate with the assigned virtual learning educator.
- \* An agreement will be signed by the student and parent/guardian that will require at a minimum of a semester commitment for the virtual learning program.

### **Highlights and Student Readiness for the Grades K-6 Program**

- \* The program and classes will be delivered virtually for students. SE Dakota Virtual Learning Consortium teachers, not Ellendale Public School staff, will help to guide and facilitate learning for all of the students in the program.
- \* All students will be enrolled in core and elective classes through the SE Dakota Virtual Learning Academy.
- \* The daily classes will follow a 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. schedule Monday – Friday.
- \* The classes will follow a week-by-week schedule and students will not be allowed to complete classes beyond the week.
- \* Once committed to Virtual Learning, EPS staff will assist with registration.
- \* Classes start on Monday, August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

### **Highlights and Student Readiness for the Grades 7-12 Program**

- \* The program and classes will be delivered virtually for students. North Dakota Center for Distance Education teachers, not Ellendale Public School staff, will help to guide and facilitate learning for all of the students in the program.
- \* All students can be enrolled in up to 6 classes through the North Dakota Center for Distance Education (NDCDE). Students in grades 9-12 may be able to enroll in 7 or more courses.
- \* All students will be expected to follow the pacing guides provided for each course.
- \* A minimum of a one semester commitment is expected, but could extend up to a full year depending on the course.
- \* Once committed to Virtual Learning, EPS staff will assist with registration.
- \* Classes will start by or before Monday, August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

# IS MY CHILD READY FOR VIRTUAL LEARNING?

## The Virtual Student Readiness Checklist

	Not Ready	Ready
<b>Technology Skills</b>	Student has little / limited experience using an educational device. For example: iPad, computer, tablet, Chromebook.  (this does not include a personal phone)	Student has strong technology skills and experience using apps, email, and web browsers.
<b>Work Habits</b>	Student often needs reminders to complete assignments, often turns in homework late, and will struggle to spend <b>5-10 hours per week</b> on <b>each</b> online course.	Student does not need reminders to complete assignments, and finishes homework on time.
<b>Learning Style</b>	Student requires adult support to complete educational tasks.	Student is comfortable working independently learning new skills without requiring adult support.
<b>Technology</b>	Student <b>does not</b> have access to reliable internet connection at home.	Student has consistent access to high speed internet.
<b>Time Management</b>	Student <b>does not</b> manage time effectively.	Student has demonstrated efficient time management skills in an educational setting.
<b>Motivation</b>	Student has little/or no interest in school. Student has a negative attitude towards learning.	Student has realistic expectations and a positive attitude towards learning. Student is motivated to learn.
<b>Reading and Writing</b>	Student has difficulty reading and writing.	Student understands what they read and is a proficient writer of age appropriate assignments.
<b>Home Support</b>	Student support system is limited. Adults are unable or unwilling to support online learning.	Student home support is strong and all parties involved are motivated to ensure student success.

When making the decision on whether your child is ready for Virtual Learning, please consider if your child is ready for this learning option. If your student is currently not ready for Virtual Learning, will they be able to quickly develop these skills.
